Albert Lincoln Wilfong

Albert Wilfong is a lifelong farmer. The farm which is now called Wilfong Farms includes 4,000 acres, of which 2,500 acres are owned and 1,500 acres are rented. The farm currently has 350 brood cows, 600 yearling cattle and a 300-ewe sheep flock. In addition to livestock, the farm also maintains a large cash crop hay business. The farm was started in 1919 by Albert's father, Charles Wilfong. Albert and his father operated the farm together until his father's death in 1970. In 1976, Albert's son Charles joined the farm full time and they have operated it together since. From its beginning, with the initial purchase of 202 acres, the farm has been operated on a cash basis. No land, cattle or machinery have been purchased unless they could be paid for at the time of purchase.



Albert Wilfong has constantly looked for innovative ways to improve productivity and profitability. He has always been one of the first to take advantage of new machinery and technology. Over the years he used the Extension Service, Soil Conservation Service and other agricultural agencies to implement pasture improvement projects, spring developments, ponds, tile drainage, aerial fertilization, crop management, crossbreeding programs, etc.

He has been involved with many agricultural organizations over the years, but his top priority has always been taking care of business on the farm. His farm experience has ranged from farming with horses as a young man, to the computer equipment of today.

His activities and memberships

include: Pocahontas County Commission President, 1984-1990; a 52-year West Virginia Farm Bureau member, serving on the county board several times; charter member of the West Virginia Cattlemen's Association and the West Virginia Shepherds' Association; State Vice-president of the Future Farmers of America; and, is currently on the Board of Directors for the Seneca State Forest Foundation.
