Bill Slagle

Walnut Meadows Tree Farm, owned and operated by Bill Slagle, has been in his family for more than 200 years. His parents made their living from the unique and diversified forest products found and produced in their forest. His multiple-use activities have been guided by a forest management plan developed in the 1960's in cooperation with the state Forestry Division.

Mr. Slagle also operates Windy Acres Limousin Ranch, a 650-acre cattle farm. In 1974, he imported the first Limousin bull to West Virginia from Ireland and devleoped a purebred Limousin herd. By working with an embryo transplant technician from Ontairo, Canada, and West Virginia University's Animal Science Program, embryo transfer was accomplished at his farm in 1979. Nine months later, using a nonsurgical procedure, the first embryo transplant live calf was delivered. In the February 1991 issue of the Market Bulletin, 37% of cattle sales were of the Limousin breed, compared to zero when Mr. Slagle introduced Limousin to the state.

Mr. Slagle's vision in life is to never accept the status quo. Instead, he constantly strives for new ways to improve and inspire. As a result, he has pioneered new concepts in several different areas. His vision is both futuristic and rational. He is a man of integrity. He sets a high personal standard by which he strives to live in all aspects of his life.
